Governing Body Vacancy

We currently have a vacancy on our Governing Body for a Parent Governor. If you think you might be interested in becoming a governor of our school please complete the attached nomination form. If you would like any further information please do come and have a chat with us. All of our school governors are listed on our 'Who's Who' board in Reception.

Election of Parent Governor

Every maintained school in England has a Governing Body responsible to the local community for running the school. There is currently one vacancy for a Parent governor at the school. The term of office will be 4 years.

If you are interested in standing for election as a Parent Governor of the school, please complete the enclosed nomination form, ensuring that you obtain the signature of 2 parents/legal guardians who support your nomination. You must also include a brief election statement. If three or more nominations are received, I shall send all parents voting papers, which will include the candidates' election statements.

The deadline for returning completed nomination forms to the school is noon on Wednesday 20 November 2024.

In the event of a ballot I will arranged for votes to be counted at a time mutually agreed with all candidates, and each candidate or his authorised representative may attend the count. I shall arrange for all parents to be notified of the result.

I have enclosed an extract from the Regulations concerning the qualifications and disqualification connected with the office of governor, which you should read carefully. If you have any queries about them or about the procedure, I shall be pleased to answer them.

All elected parent governors are required to complete an enhanced criminal record application (DBS) within 21 days of their election.



Hats, coats & hairbands! There has been a distinct nip in the air towards the end of this week, which is a sign of colder times ahead. As you know, we love that your children are able to enjoy our outside spaces all year round, but we do want them to be appropriately dressed and warm. If your child intends to play football at playtime, or any game potentially involving getting

dirty, then they need to have clothes with them to cover up there uniform and keep it clean.

Please ensure that your child has a coat, particularly when the weather is wet, even if you arrive by car in the morning. As the weather becomes colder, a warm hat and gloves will also be needed.

Whilst on the subject of things to wear on your head... thank you for ensuring that children with longer hair have it tied back. For the purpose of minimising distraction, we ask that headbands or anything used to tie hair back are in a muted colour (blue, black, grey, brown etc), which is in keeping with the school uniform, and are simple in style. Thank you.



Activ8 Wraparound Care—coming soon

We are currently in the process of applying for Government funding to secure the need for Wraparound Care in school between the hours of 3.00 and 6.00 pm (including snack and tea).

Activ8 are an established company providing Wraparound Care and curriculum provision in schools and we are hoping to be able to work together to enjoy this at our school with a view to starting in January.

This would be in place of our current Care Bears provision which is limited in days and between 3.00 and 4.00pm. We will still run our own Breakfast Bears between 8.00 and 8.30am for those who need this.

Activ8 will be joining us during our Parents Evenings next week; Tuesday during the whole session and Wednesday from 4.45 until 6pm. They will be available to give you all the information you will need and to answer any questions and queries you may have about this provision.


